

How to read your new Support at Home statement

Support at Home helps people stay living at home longer by funding various services such as clinical care, everyday living support, home modifications and assistive technology.

The statement you receive summarises services you've used, how much funding is available to you, what's been spent, and what remains.

Each budget has a page with a summary of spending and balance, and a following page breaking down each expense.

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Financial summary

Understanding your financial summary

The first page of your statement includes a financial summary table. This table shows your approved Support at Home budgets, how much was spent this month, and how much remains available.

The example statement shows every possible budget type. Most people will only have one or two of these. Your statement will display only the budget types that apply to you.

² The budget name

Your applicable Support at Home budgets.

³ Spending and available balance

Each budget row shows the spending from the previous month, the current month of spending and the remaining budget balance.

⁴ Applicable date range

Under the budget name, you'll see the date range applicable to this budget type. This is the period during which that money is available to be used.

Ongoing quarterly home support summary

Funding for your regular, day-to-day support services such as personal care, domestic help, nursing and allied health. The funding is provided quarterly.

Ongoing quarterly home support

This is the main funding you receive every quarter to cover the supports and services in your plan. It can be used for daily living assistance, social activities, or other approved services that help you live independently.

Provider and government-held unspent funds

Unspent funds from your previous Home Care Package may be held either by your provider or by the government. If you have any unspent funds you will see a page for one or both on your statement. Provider-held funds are used first, and any government-held funds are drawn down only after the provider-held balance is exhausted.

Provider-held HCP unspent funds	
These are unspent funds that transitioned with you from your Home Care Package and are held by your provider. They can be used when your ongoing or short-term funding (e.g. restorative care or end-of-life funding) is exhausted, or must be used upfront for assistive technology or home modification services.

Unlike the above ongoing home support care management, both the hours and associated costs are drawn down from the Restorative Care or End-of-Life budget (depending on your funding), so you can see exactly how your funding is used. No client contribution is required as care management is a clinical service.
